## **<u>1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY</u>**

## **1.1 INTRODUCTION**

Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya, the second oldest educational institution in Tripura, is situated at Kailashahar, the headquarters of Unakoti District, Tripura. It was established on 1st September 1950 under the aegis of the local Ramkrishna Ashrama. The founder of the college was Brahmachari Tapas Chaitanya Maharaj. The main motto behind the establishment of this institute was to spread man-making and character-building education.

This extraordinary initiative of higher education adopted by the youths of the locality became successful due to the whole-hearted cooperation of the local people. At the initial stage, the college had a few students, and classes were conducted under a tin shed and even under the shade of jackfruit trees in the Ashrama. The college was run by the donations of the common people of the locality.

The Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya bears the legacy of popular struggle and aspiration for higher education. In 1982, the college was undertaken by the Government of Tripura. With the passage of time, the institution acquired a well-structured campus of its own and started attracting students from different parts of the state.

Presently, the college offers Undergraduate Degree programs, including Major and General Courses, in Science, Arts, and Commerce through a Credit-Based Semester System. In the course of its glorious journey of over 71 years, the college has managed to run 19 departments, one Distance Education Centre of Tripura University and one IGNOU Study Center.

On March 4, 1989, the college got affiliation from the University Grant Commission (UGC) under sections 12(B) and 2(F). In 2004, the college was assessed by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in the first cycle. In the year 2015, the NAAC assessed the college in its second cycle and accredited it with 1.89 points. The college is working on the recommendations of the NAAC peer team.

The total campus area of the college is 19.2721 acres, encompassing the Administrative Block, Arts Block, Commerce Block, Science Block, Quarter Complexes, Water Body, and Stadium.

## **1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY**

## **Curricular Aspects**

Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya is an affiliated college, and the curriculum provided by Tripura University is adopted by the institution. The institution has developed structured and effective implementations of the curriculum for an effective teaching-learning process. Curriculum delivery involves ICT-based lectures, assignments, circulating question papers; syllabus, study materials for the students, continuous supervision, interaction, mentoring, project work, counseling, participative and collaborative learning processes are initiated; steps are taken to develop the reasoning and communication skills of the students. The college offers B.A., B.Sc., and B.Com. programmes in various subjects. Tripura University routinely conducts two internal examinations in each semester followed by a final university examination. The exact date for the internal examination is finalized by the college examination committee and that of the final examination by the Controller of Examinations, Tripura University. In the final year, students have a project paper and the objective is to augment their critical thinking, analytical and collaborative learning skills. Teachers are engaged in the curriculum design of TU, being members of the Board of Studies and other related committees. The academic calendar is prepared as per the Tripura University (TU) academic schedule and DHE holiday list with requirements and suggestions made by the academic committee that includes various departments and committees. Through various courses, viz., gender studies, environment and sustainability, human values, and professional ethics-based courses, are included in the syllabus under Tripura University that integrate various issues related to society and real life. Constructive feedback is taken from the students, parents, alumni, and teachers to scrutinize whether learning outcomes are being achieved or not. Based on their feedback, effective guidance is given to the needy learners that enable them to improve their academic activities and reports are uploaded to the college website.

## **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

The college has a transparent admission process as directed by the Directorate of Higher Education. The

students admitted to this institution are from rural areas with the vernacular medium. The college follows the reservation policy as laid down by the state government. In the last five years, more than 4000 students have been admitted to Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya. Admission for all the semesters starts at the beginning of the academic year. T.U's internal assessment is a transparent and accountable mechanism that strictly adheres to Tripura University examination rules and regulations. T.U routinely conducts two internal examinations in each semester followed by a final university examination. Teachers observe and identify the slow and advanced learners based on the student's performance and interaction in the classroom lectures. Teachers also provide remedial classes at the departmental level for slow learners and interested students by providing study materials, revision and clarifying the doubts. Advanced learners are also motivated to take part in various activities like debates, quizzes, and writing in the yearly college magazine/ e-magazine 'Shri'. They are also advised to explore new ideas and knowledge by reading books and the internet as well. Teachers of various subjects adopt student-centric methodologies in teaching by focusing on their level of understanding. The centre of teaching is on application-based methodology and real-life examples as per the course designed by Tripura University. The teachers are using ICT-enabled classes with e-resources for the students to make an effective teaching-learning process and create a healthy environment for academic activities. ICT tools and resources available in the college are Laptop, Computer, Projector, Projector screen, PA system, LCD Projector, wi-fi, LAN, Printer, Scanner, Audio-Visual Equipment, 300 MBPS FTTH LAN connections from BSNL, Smart board etc. The college library is wifi enabled and has open access for all. The students are assigned mentors for their improvement in academic activities and to resolve other issues. The performances of the students are assessed as per university guidelines. The IQAC collects online feedback from students on the teaching-learning process and analyses the feedback for improvement and uploads the report to the college website.

#### **Research, Innovations and Extension**

The college encourages research activities on the campus by inspiring the faculties to get funds from various funding agencies, i.e., government and non-government institutions, by applying through research proposals. The college also inspires the faculties to get funds for seminars, workshops, and other related programmes to promote academic activities in the college with a research culture. Faculty members are also encouraged to participate and present research papers and deliver special talks and lectures in the seminars, workshops, and conferences. The college encourages the faculties to write books, articles and research papers in edited books and journals.

Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya has active NSS and NCC units which continuously carry out awareness and sensitization programmes and events in the college as well as in its adopted village and neighborhood. The NSS and NCC units perform their extension activities and other related work as per the advice of the college authorities and the resources available to them. The various activities organized by the NSS and NCC units on social issues helps the students to enrich their knowledge, build their character and personality as well as contribute to nation building. These extension activities help the students gain knowledge about reality and difficulties faced in the field and also learn about management. During the COVID-19 situation, NSS and NCC units helped the local administration through various means, like creating awareness about COVID-19 among people and motivating people to get vaccinated, helping in the vaccination process at the grassroots levels as per requirements. The NSS unit also arranged a COVID-19 vaccination camp in the adopted village. The NSS and NCC units of Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya continuously work for the well-being of society and nation-building.

#### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

Ramakrishna Mahavidyalaya has gone through several phases of development over time. During these processes, the institution has accumulated and gathered enough infrastructure and physical facilities as and when required for the teaching-learning process. There is one "equipped smart classroom", a "conference hall" and a "Sukanta Hall" for holding programmes and other activities. The faculties are using ICT-enabled tools in the teaching-learning process. The laboratories of the science streams are quite equipped. There is no dearth of equipment and accessories as per the requirements of the syllabus and students. The Institute has a considerable number of computers and printers for official and academic purposes. The college has enough physical facilities like classrooms, laboratories, playground, gyms, libraries, and one health care room, etc. for the teachinglearning process and other activities. The college strongly believes in co-curriculum activities for the overall development of the students while keeping up with the modern educational system. The college library has about 40,000 books and journals, and the numbers are increasing. The college's cultural committee, IQAC, Red Ribbon Club, and various cells are engaged in various awareness-related programmes which are somehow related to students' curriculum outcomes. The college publishes a college magazine named "Shri" every year where students and teachers actively participate. The Physical Education department not only provides textbook knowledge of the subject but also extracurricular knowledge such as officiating, coaching, leadership qualities, recreation, health and fitness, etc. The department strives to create a safe and healthy environment for its students and faculties.

Under the supervision of the Department of Higher Education, the Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya works on the nature and process of government policies. The designated principal by virtue of post is the custodian. The college gets funds from RUSA, UGC, and the government for the upliftment and up-gradation of college infrastructure and learning resources. The college has a College Development Committee, RUSA, and UGC Committee to plan and chalk out the procedure for college development work in terms of renovation, up-gradation, creation of new facilities, and construction. The tender committee helps in placing the tender for various materials.

#### **Student Support and Progression**

In the aspects of student support and progression, the college has achieved a considerable position. The state government as well as the central government support students by providing scholarships. A considerable number of students have received the scholarship during the last five years. The college also supports its students through placement cells by providing guidance for various competitive examinations, job interview skills, capacity building and skill enhancement programmes. The students receive support from various cells and committees for issues associated with them. The college has Grievance Redressal cell, Anti-Ragging cell, Anti-Sexual Harassment Cell, Discipline Committee, SC/ST/OBC and Minority cell.

The progress of our students in the fields of placement, competitive examinations, participation in games and sports, and higher studies is highly satisfactory. The participation of the students in various college and university level, state and national level sports activities is satisfactory. A number of students achieved medals in different games and sports activities at different levels. Student representatives disseminate information to the rest of the students as received from the college administration and other committees and assist in the overall development of the college. They assist the teachers in planning, organizing, and executing various student-oriented activities. They act as mediators between students and teachers to share, discuss, and solve their problems, if any. Besides these, the college also encourages the students in co-curriculum and extra-curriculum activities through NSS, NCC, Red Ribbon Club and other committees.

The college has a registered alumni association and the members of this association are helping the college in its development through collaboration with IQAC and the Teachers' Council. At each yearly meeting, the Alumni Association supports the college by assisting in the cleaning of the campus, neighborhood, and wetland. The Alumni Association also gifted a few dustbins to the college to maintain cleanliness inside the campus. The Alumni Association keeps on providing their valuable feedback regularly for the continuation and improvement of an effective teaching-learning process and also infrastructural development for the college.

#### **Governance, Leadership and Management**

Ramakrishna Mahavidyalaya intends to generate human resources out of the bulk of youths belonging to this remote area, inculcated with appropriate skills, values, and commitment to adapt themselves to the fast-changing national and global environment. The Principal of the college is the head of the institute and is assisted by the DDO, T.C. Secretary, HoDs, and coordinator/convener of various cells and committees. For the decentralized administration and participatory management, the principal formulates various cells and committees for the smooth functioning of the teaching-learning process. Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya is a government institution and follows government directives in forming various committees and cells.

The institute, by knowing its status through the parameters of SWOC analysis, started its own journey with some objectives being fulfilled on the way, while much effort is still being put into the process. The college administration, in consultation with IQAC, the Teachers' Council, and the College Development Committee, chalked out the plan for future development. The college also follows the appointments and service rules laid down by the Government of Tripura and the UGC.

The institute follows the guidelines of DHE. The welfare schemes available for teaching and non-teaching staff of this institute are as follows: GPF, GI, festival advance, LTC, etc. The college provides professional skill development activities for its staff for the smooth functioning of the academic and administrative processes. The Performance Appraisal System is conducted centrally by the Directorate of Higher Education.

The records of finance and accounts are properly maintained by the DDO and Accounts Section of the college. As a government institution, external and internal audits are done by A&G and DHE. Store and library verification is done at regular intervals by concerned committees. Practical-based departments maintain stock registers for individual departments. Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya has an active and vibrant internal quality assurance cell, formed on 19/07/2010. The IQAC of the college takes initiative in planning, guiding, and monitoring the overall teaching-learning process, methodologies of teaching, and outcomes for the quality improvement and overall development of the college.

#### **Institutional Values and Best Practices**

Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya is built on the thoughts and teachings of Saint Sri Ramakrishna Paramhansa and Sri Swami Vivekananda, who united everyone irrespective of caste and creed. The college cultivates the values and morals to carry out its social responsibilities through various means by pertaining to the different areas, i.e., gender equality, energy conservation, green audit and waste management etc. During the last five years, the college has organized various gender-sensitization and other related programmes. The LED lights are an alternative source of energy on the campus. The solid waste generated in the campus is not much in volume and weight. Liquid waste generated from the toilets is directly drained through the sub-drains to the main drain. Chemical and bio-medical waste production in the chemistry, botany, zoology, and human physiology labs are

disposed of by maintaining proper safety measures. Chemically hazardous wastes are added with other chemicals to make them non-hazardous and then disposed of. The bio-medical wastes generated by the human physiology department are stored in the bins by maintaining safety measures. The college has a separate room for keeping the e-waste generated in the campus. The college started landscaping the campus with trees and plants as an initiative for a green campus. The campus is plastic free and the college restricts the entry of heavy vehicles in terms of air and noise pollution. A green and energy audit is conducted from time to time. College buildings are equipped with Divyang friendly toilets. The college library is wifi enabled. The college has prescribed an internal code of conduct for teaching and non-teaching staff and students. The teachers are engaged in faculty development programmes, attend seminars and workshops, and publish research papers and articles.

Among the best practices, the college has introduced a soil testing centre in collaboration with the Department of Geography since the academic year 2017–18. The testing centre is open for students and is free of charge. The college has also set up a rainwater harvesting unit with the existing resources. Apart from these two, the college also engages its students in various academic and awareness programmes.

	faculties of economics, IT, and mathematics departments teach core courses every academic year like business economics and business mathematics, business statistics, management, computer skills, information technology, and e-commerce. The faculty of the IT department teaches the Foundation Course (FNDC-V Computer skill), Commerce, and some parts of the Mathematics department (C- programming) every academic year. In addition, faculties from the Law are invited to teach commercial law and other interdisciplinary courses every academic year. Interdisciplinary courses are available in the departments of IT, Economics, Geography, and Mathematics. These courses have some knowledge of commerce, among other subjects like IT, mathematics, and economics.
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	The Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) concept is a very useful acronym to embrace the flexibility required to provide a comprehensive education in the Indian environment. The rules laid down by the affiliated universities and higher education departments will determine the extent to which the institution is prepared to carry out the academic bank of credits. The institute maintains continuous and productive interaction with affiliated Tripura University and Higher Education Department to stay up to date with latest strategies and regulations. The state government and universities have organized various eye-opening seminars and workshops. It is important to note that on 22nd and 23rd February, 2022, the Principal i/c of the Institute participated in a two-day workshop held at Tripura University Campus. There were two resource persons—one from UP and another from M.P. who participated and gave their practical and down-to-earth approach to implementing NEP-2020. Two national level webinars on NEP-2020 have been organized under the initiative of Department of Education and NCC of the institution. Under the prescribed CBCS pattern curriculum being taught currently, there are credits assigned to papers which are not transferable but with the upcoming implementation of NEP in the academic year 2022-23, students will create a bank of credit which will be transferable and interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary in nature, Students will also have multiple entry exit options as per their requirements. For this purpose, a centralized database

	will be set up along with the college database to digitally store the academic credits earned by the students from various courses so that the previously earned credits can be forwarded when the students re- entry into the programme. An appropriate technical support system should be developed for ABC monitoring.
3. Skill development:	The institution has taken the following initiatives with the strength of skill development of students with the existing infrastructure: i. The institute tries its best in every possible way to provide best teaching methodologies, mentoring and remedial classes to the students to enhance their subject skill with the limited resources. ii. The institute organizes seminars, workshops, talks and other academic events for students to enhance their subject skills for future employability. iii. The institute has taken initiatives to enhance students' skill in the field of Agricultural and allied activities like fishery, rice cultivation etc. and irrespective of programme, every student is allowed to familiarize themselves with the basic knowledge of IT through compulsory foundation paper in the 4th Sem. iv. The faculty of commerce teaches its students employment friendly elements i.e. corporate laws, firm management, complete balance sheet knowledge and initiatives taken to teach GST and ITR filing to enhance their skills.
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	There is no such incorporated system that exists in the institution to transmit the Indian knowledge system online however the institution is hopeful to introduce such course through online mode very soon. The institute teaches its students irrespective of programmes, Modern Indian languages and Indian Heritage and Culture in the foundation course of 2nd Semester. The history dept. through its curriculum and extra-curriculum activities, disseminate knowledge about Indian Arts, culture, monuments and archaeological sites which stands as our heritage and treasure.
5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):	As the Institution is affiliated to Tripura University and follows the curriculum framed by Tripura University; but, the institution tries its best to provide outcome based education to its students through practical work and real life experience. The traditional approach is used in the campus for teaching. Apart from these, the institution uses the

	modern tools and applications of ICT. The institution conducted field studies through various departments where students get practical and real life experience of the environment. The students undergo a project paper in a certain semester and faculties supervise them to complete the project work.
6. Distance education/online education:	The institution facilitates distance education for those students who has physical, financial and professional constrains and can't pursue degree in regular mode in the campus. The institution provides UG and PG programmes through Tripura University Distance Education Mode and IGNOU. The commencement of Tripura University Distance Education Centre in the campus was 2009 and since then, students are taking admission in CBCS UG programmes (BA General) with following subjects like Bengali, English, History, Political Science, Education and other soft skill subjects with foundation subjects. The distance education students are taught on Sundays only and rest of the days are operative for official works if needed. The institution has IGNOU study Centre in the campus and is operative since 2003. The Centre provides certificate, diploma, PG diploma, Honours and General programmes for both UG and PG level in compliance with rules and regulations framed by IGNOU. The Centre provides above mentioned courses in the following subjects i.e. Environmental Studies, Nutrition, Political Science, Economics, Social Work, History, English, Education, Rural Development and Commerce. The Centre provides BCA and MCA programme also. The classes are conducted on Sunday and rest of the days are operative for official works.

# **2.2.1** The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organises special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

## **Response:**

The students admitted to this institution are from rural areas with vernacular medium. Teachers observe and identify the slow and advanced learners based on the student's performance and interaction in the classroom lectures. As slow learners sometimes fail to understand the classroom lectures, are asked to read the topic which the teacher supposed to teach in the very next class to make out the gap which exists while understanding the topics taught in the classroom lectures. Slow learner students are also motivated in the classroom lectures by asking brainstorming questions to stimulate the interest in studies. Teachers also provide remedial classes at the departmental level for slow learners and interested students and help them by providing study materials, revision and clarifying the doubts. The advanced learners are given assignments and homework for doing intensive studies and encourage them to perform well in the Internal as well as University examination. Advanced learners are also motivated to take part in various activities like debates, quiz, and writing in the yearly college magazine/ e-magazine 'Shri', and provide the students a platform to express their creative ability. They are also advised to explore new ideas and knowledge by reading books and articles as well.

## **2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms**

## 2.5.1 Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode

## **Response:**

Internal Assessment is a transparent and accountable mechanism that strictly adheres to Tripura University examination rules and regulations. An internal assessment is conducted twice in a semester comprising of 10 marks in each assessment. The assessment includes both descriptive and objective questions. The students are informed about the internal assessment examination well in advance, and the faculties discuss the question patterns and provide study materials or clarify any doubts or queries.

Following the written assessment, faculty members discuss the students' strengths and weaknesses and provide feedback accordingly. The answer scripts are shown to the students so that they can analyze their performance, and if any students fail to secure the minimum pass marks, they are allowed to re-appear the test in order to improve their marks. Furthermore, if some students fail to appear in the test, they are only permitted to re-appear if they have a valid reason, with the consent of their parents or with the permission of the Principal.

According to the Tripura University Guidelines, students sixth semester are required to complete a project work worth 100 marks. Students are allowed to select a topic of their own interest based on their subject and teacher guides them to complete the project work.

# **2.5.2** Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

### 4.1 Physical Facilities

**4.1.1** The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

### **Response:**

Ramakrishna Mahavidyalaya has gone through several phases of development over time. During these processes, the Institution has accumulated and gathered enough infrastructures and physical facilities, as and when required for teaching - learning process. However, it is to state that the measurement of adequate infrastructure of the College is temporal in nature and not static. The classrooms available for various subjects are insufficient for teaching-learning process but will be easily managed once science departments are shifted to 'New Science Block'. There is one 'equipped smart classroom ', 'Conference Hall' and 'Sukanta Hall' for holding awareness programs and other activities. The laboratories of science streams are quite equipped. There are no dearth of equipments and accessories as per requirements of the syllabus and students. However, some of the laboratories equipments have become obsolete which is liable for replacing. The Institute has considerable computers, but some have become obsolete and malfunctioning. Most of the Departments are allotted with computers and printers for official and academic purposes. The college has enough physical facilities like playground, gym, library, pond etc. The College tactfully handles with the minimum infrastructure and physical facilities available without much hindrance and smoothly conduct the teaching learning process.

**4.1.2** The Institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga centre etc.

### **Response:**

The college strongly believes in co-curricular activities so that students can grow in all areas while keeping up with the modern educational system. As a result, this institution has a Cultural Committee that oversees the various cultural activities to be performed starting from College Foundation Day, Fresher's Welcome, college week, Teachers' Day, organizing quiz competitions, publication of college magazine named 'Shri', celebrating national and international, commemorative days on campus etc. Almost all departments maintain a wall magazine in which students contribute their write-ups and drawings, which highlight their talents. The departments like Geography, Zoology etc. which has field work study, students get real life experiences about the reality of that particular area.

There is a Physical Education department at the college and department not only provides textbook knowledge of the subject, but also extracurricular knowledge such as officiating, coaching, leadership qualities, recreation, health and fitness etc. The department strives to create a safe and healthy environment for its students and faculties. Along with academic excellence, the college administration places an emphasis on sports - both indoor games like carrom, chess, ludo, Table Tennis etc. and outdoor games like volleyball, football, and cricket. The game facilities are being raised to a satisfactory level for students and are under the strict supervision of Physical Education department for achieving all-round development, primarily from the perspective of mind and body of students.

### 6.3.5 Institutions Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non-teaching staff

#### **Response:**

The most methodical technique of assessing an employee's performance is through Performance Appraisal. It makes the employee more accountable for the work he does. It also motivates teachers to conduct research in order to improve their knowledge. The Performance Appraisal System is conducted centrally by the Directorate of Higher Education. For this purpose, the Gazetted officers are given the Annual Confidential Report (ACR) format for their self-appraisal annually. The Principal evaluates the ACR, which is then forwarded to the Directorate of Higher Education for further action. On the basis of this ACR for Career Advancement i.e., promotion is given. Non-teaching staff is not given any appraisal format as their promotion is based on a seniority basis, but they were asked to provide at the time before their promotion, which is conducted by the Department of Higher Education from time to time. However, to make the non-teaching staff aware of different advancements made in the official matters, they are deputed for various training programmes such as accounting training conducted by the Finance Department, Government of Tripura and librarian training for digitizing college traditional library organized by Birchandra State Central Library from time to time to enhance their potentiality

### 6.4.3 Institutional strategies for mobilisation of funds and the optimal utilisation of resources

### **Response:**

Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya College is a Government funded institution under DHE, Government of Tripura. Besides that it also receives funds from agencies like UGC and RUSA for its academic and infrastructure development activities. There are UGC and RUSA coordinators in the college to communicate with the funding agencies. They maintain the records of the funds received and the expenses borne for college development separately. There is a Development Committee in the college which looks after the requirements of the various departments and the college itself. College also has a purchasing committee which carries out the work of purchasing the materials required for the college such as books, computers, laboratory equipments, chemicals, extension of infrastructure facilities, repairing works etc. The Principal calls for tender or quotation through tender committee for purchase or others. A regular meeting is held time to time by the all concerned committee members with the Principal to decide and set the developmental goals and informed to all. The members also decide for the next set of development goals in the meeting and the funds is utilized accordingly.

### **Response:**

Initiatives in e-feedback collection: IQAC has already introduced e-feedback forms to collect feedback from concerned stakeholders including student satisfactory survey for the academic session 2020-21. All the feedback responses acquired from the sources and analysis report was auto generated without much effort. With this e-feedback form, college saves time and money. The analysis report was then discussed with the faculty members and asked them to go through the report minutely and work for further improvement.

Online-Offline Teaching Learning Process and Academic & Awareness Activities: The IQAC took the initiatives to introduce online-offline teaching learning process by using available means. This initiative helps a lot to the students as few students don't appear for the classes due to ill-health and financial constraints. For those students, alternate online classes were arranged by respective departments to fill the gap. The departments, cells and IQAC together performed various seminars, lectures and other academic activities with awareness programmes and extension activities.

The solid waste generation in the campus is not much in volume and weight. The assigned staffs were given bins to sweep the campus on regular basis and disposed off in the pit and also in the KMC provided garbage bins. The liquid waste generated from the laboratories is disposed off with proper manner by the respective departments whereas liquid waste generated from the toilets is directly gone to the sub-drains to the main drain. Chemical and bio-medical waste production in the chemistry, botany, and zoology labs and human physiology lab are disposal off by maintaining proper safety measures. Chemical hazardous wastes are added with other chemicals and make it non-hazardous and then disposed off in the container. The bio-medical wastes generated from the human physiology department are stored in the bins by maintaining the safety measures. The wastes are generated from these labs are collected by the KMC collection staffs on regular basis. The college authority tells continuously to the staffs for e-waste management in the campus. The college repairs those equipments which are reusable. The college has separate room for keeping the e-waste generated like non-working computers, printers, cartridges, various electrical equipments etc. from the college itself.

By borrowing the concepts from Swamiji, the vision of this institution focuses on building mankind with freedom of thoughts; developing sustainable human society, personality development of students by adopting new technology of Science and Technology, imparting quality education and research oriented programmes. Faculties are encouraged to apply for research funds and funds for organizing seminars and awareness related programmes. Ramkrishna Mahavidyalaya always focuses on all-round development of its students. The Institution also focuses on programmes where students may learn about moral values and ethics to build a good character and individuals .College continuously encourages its students to enroll themselves in NSS and NCC units for 'Nation building'. NSS volunteers and NCC cadets engage themselves in regular activities, extension activities and out-reach programmes. These above mentioned aspects are performed by the institution on priority basis and considered as focal point which contributes in nation building. Along with that, college is also having Girls' hostel with near about 70 seats capacity, Women's hostel with 8 seats capacity and staff quarters.

### ICT Infrastructure

The college has its own G-suite ids to run online teaching-learning process uninterrupted, student oriented and proactive. The faculties use PPTs, videos, e-materials, e-books and other study materials in e-format so that it may reach the students without delay. ICT tools and resources available in the college are Laptop, Computer, Projector, Projector screen, PA system, LCD Projector, WI-FI, LAN, Printer, Scanner, Audio-Visual Equipments, 300 MBPS FTTH LAN connections from BSNL, Smart board etc.

### Library

The college also has a library with a collection of numerous books which are well- organized and properly maintained. It helps the students to avail their necessary books and ensures that every student can make a good use of the library reading room. The college library is Wi-Fi enabled for all staffs and students so that they can access e-resources with the help of teachers. The faculties also share the website links for various academic videos, e-shoudhganga, free e-journals etc. for the betterment of students by using ICT tools to upgrade the learning experience of students in easy way. The faculties have e-content and case studies developed by themselves which they share with the students and staffs for easy understanding.

### Laboratory

To provide excellent academic knowledge to the students and also perform research oriented works, the college gives priority in catering the better infrastructural facilities. The college has well established laboratories for different subjects like Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology, Botany, Human Physiology and Geography. The computer lab is open for everyone to do their works like learning C programming by Mathematics department students, preparation of assignments, project paper etc.

### Gymnasium & Playground

The Department of Physical Education comprising of its faculty and staff looks after the timely utilization of Gym center and its maintenance with the help of Games and Sports committee. The faculties and students utilize the Gym equipments regularly to make themselves fit and sound. The college has its own playground just backside of the college where students do practice and play games and also even for other purposes.

### **Teaching-Learning Process**

Teachers of various subjects adopt student centric methodologies in teaching by putting focus on their level of understanding. The centre of teaching is on application based methodology and real life examples as per the course designed by Tripura University. Besides teaching, faculties also uses classroom interaction, group discussion, individual and group assignments, organizing departmental seminars, quiz, field study and individual project work activities. The college also put emphasis on universal learning outcomes such as communication skills, problem solving techniques, critical thinking, reasoning, life skills, creativity and innovative ideas along with human values. Students are continuously encouraged to develop these skills through participatory learning methods by means of group discussion, departmental seminars, event management, and co-curriculum and extra-curriculum activities.

### **Cultural Activities**

The college strongly believes in co-curricular activities so that students can grow in all areas while keeping up with the modern educational system. As a result, this institution has a Cultural Committee that oversees the various cultural activities to be performed starting from Republic Day, College Foundation Day, Fresher's Welcome, Teachers' Day, Saraswati Puja, Kokborok Day, publication of college e-magazine, celebrating national and international commemorative events on campus etc. Few departments maintain wall magazine and wall paintings, which highlight their hidden talents and also motivates and inspires them for an all round development.

### NCC & NSS

The college has NCC unit for both girls and boys. The intake capacity of NCC girls' wing and boys' wing is more than 100 cadets. The college NCC is engaged in various regional and national camps and other related extension activities for the society. The college has NSS unit having intake capacity of 100. The NSS unit is engaged in various awareness programme in the college as well as outside of the campus. The NSS volunteers and NCC cadets are the forerunner in donating blood to the patients who are in need in collaboration with 'Blood Donation Cell'.

### **Distance study Centre**

The college has Distance Education centre under Directorate of Distance Education, Tripura University (A Central University) and IGNOU study centre for those who are in difficulties to carry out their study in regular mode. A Prisoner from Kailashahar jail successfully passed his graduation from this distance education centre.
